## Snippets from Council Ordinary Council Meeting 26 March

#### APPLICATIONS FOR ASSISTANCE TO NON PROFIT LOCAL GROUPS

Council were asked to donate \$200 to the Midwest Group of Affiliated Agricultural Societies. Council have donated to this group in the past and agreed to again this year. The display at the Royal Show will have a feature section for Mount Magnet.

FESA ran courses four our Volunteer Fire Brigade over two weeks. Council was asked to waive the fees for Recreation Centre hire because the pool of money that the volunteer group have allocated to them from FESA would be reduced. Council agreed to donate the hiring of the facility.

A Scout group, organised by Scout Group Leader Mr Ndonga is being started in Mount Magnet. Council was asked that in order to help the group become established could they have some fees reduced until they are up and running. Council agreed to waive charges for the use of the community bus, Recreation Centre and swimming pool for the Mount Magnet Scout Group for the period 18 April to 30 December 2010.

The newly formed Mount Magnet

Sports Club Steering Committee asked that fees for their meetings be waived for the Recreation Centre use. Again as it is a newly formed group, Council wished to encourage the initiative and agreed to assist.

#### BETTER BEGINNINGS STORY TIME SESSIONS

0-3 year olds 10am - 1am fortnightly beginning Tues 27 April And 4 - 8 year olds 3pm every Monday in school term.

Last year the Mount Magnet Library became involved in the Better Beginnings Program for early childhood development. The project is being supported again this year and Story Time sessions are underway at the Library.

The equipment that was bought by Council last year will be taken out of it's box and put to good use entertaining and teaching children in literacy skills.

The program is reliant on volunteers to come and read to the children and accompanying parents/carers. It is a program that encourages parents/carers to read stories to their children.

#### ALCHOHOL ABUSE IS BEING ADDRESSED IN THE SHIRE

Melanie Hearse from the Drug and Alcohol Office contacted the Shire regarding the formation of a Mount Magnet Alcohol Management Committee that would meet on a monthly basis to pool resources, identify gaps in service delivery and draft a Mount Magnet Alcohol Management Strategy.

Council are keen to support efforts to reduce the incorrect use of alcohol drinks and realise that any Mount Magnet Alcohol Management Strategy would need to include prevention and education, community awareness programs, treatment and support strategies as well as any policing and legislation recommendations.

There is already a Mount Magnet Liquor Accord Group comprised of representatives from; local licensees and liquor, Western Australian Police, Shire of Mount Magnet, representatives of the Mount Magnet Community and Department of Health. The group wishes to "achieve a standard of practice in the local liquor industry that will assist in fostering a responsible drinking culture and safer community."

The recently formed Mount Magnet Community Women Group who wish for a less violent community are also willing to be involved.





THE ECONOMIC AND INDUSTRY STANDING COMMITTEE is conducting an inquiry into the Dept of Environment and Sonservations' management of former pastoral leases.

The Committee is investigating DEC's management of pest animals and weekd, preservation of pastoral heritage, opportunities for improved management and a consideration of the economic potential of non-pastoral uses for the land. The Committee intends to visit Mount Magnet in late April and would like the opportunity to talk to local shires, pastoralists and others about these issues.

#### **NET SET GO**

San Remo NETSETGO is Netball Australia's Junior Netball Program. It has been developed to provide children form the age of five to 10 years with the best possible learning and playing experience that enables them to develop a positive introduction to Netball, ensuring enjoyment and continued participation within the sport.

The program incorporates the modified junior program FUNNET and the modified junior netball game NETTA. NET SET GO participants will receive a netball bag and junior size netball.

8 to 10 year olds doing the NETTA PROGRAM
