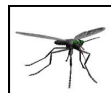

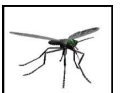

MESSAGE FROM THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

I need to introduce myself. My name is Eddie Piper and I took up the Acting CEO position on 29 September. I now live on the Gold Coast in Queensland however I spent 20 years in Kalgoorlie and am comfortable with the coming dry heat.

The Shire faces a challenging period with the most important being the selection of a new Chief Executive Officer. In July the Shire contracted WALGA to advertise, and source suitable applicants however, despite there being almost 20 applications, none were considered suitable. The process is continuing.

Since arriving in town I have noticed many dogs roaming loose in town and I take this opportunity to repeat the previous ACEO's message:

The onus for a dog rests with the owner. It is your responsibility to ensure that the dog is licensed, micro-chipped and kept under control. Under control means ensuring the dog is not able to wander the streets, and if it is not in your property it is on a leash.

The licensing and micro-chipping is essential so that the ownership of a dog can be identified and the owner notified if the dog is seized. Having the dog under control should prevent attacks on people or other animals, and also save the owner from severe penalties.

Instructions have been given to the Shire Ranger to conduct additional patrols and to seize dogs roaming the Streets. Heed this warning or be prepared to pay the consequences.

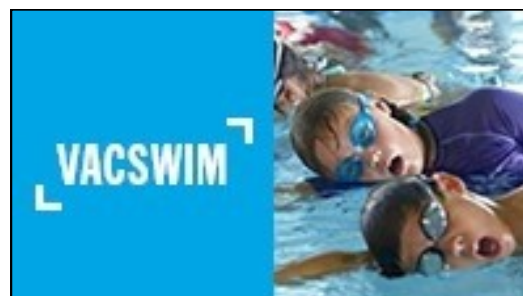

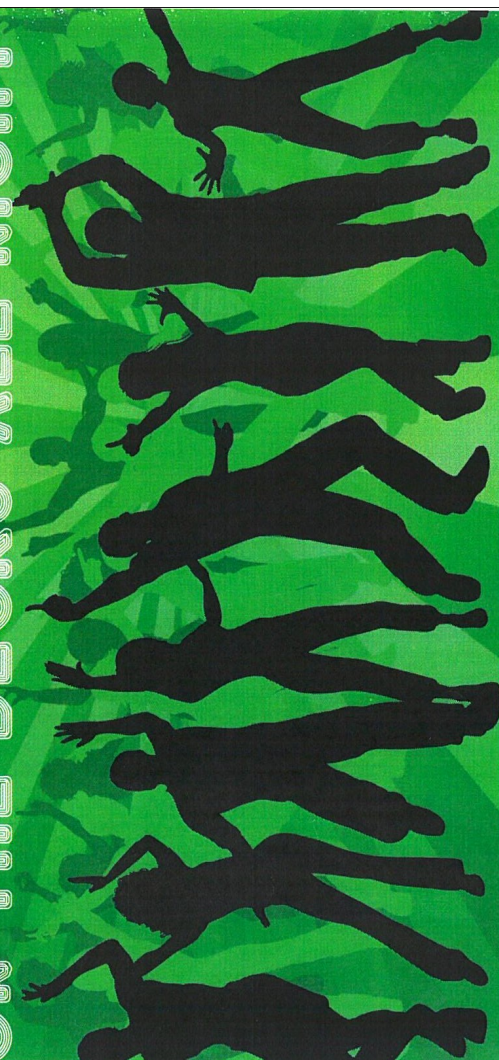

Airline agreement continues to benefit regions

Thursday, 20 October 2016

- **Deed of agreement extended for Northern WA air routes until mid-2018**
- **Agreement maintains current service levels**

Regional communities in northern Western Australia will continue to receive regular air services to and from Perth, following the extension of Skippers Aviation's deed of agreement on air routes for Carnarvon-Monkey Mia and the Northern Goldfields until July 1, 2018.

Transport Minister Bill Marmion said the local communities would maintain their current level of service, with Carnarvon to receive 10 flights a week, while Monkey Mia and Northern Goldfields regional towns would receive four and three flights a week respectively.

"Since 2011, Skippers has operated on these regulated routes under deeds of agreement with the State, and despite declining passenger demand, they have been able to maintain a set level of service over the years," Mr Marmion said.

"Skippers' strategy of using different sized aircraft with 50, 36, 30 or 19 seats, allows the airline operational flexibility to respond to passenger number variations."

The Liberal National Government would continue to monitor demand and market conditions on the Carnarvon-Monkey Mia and Northern Goldfields routes, and will consider recommended options from the Department of Transport regarding long-term decisions on the routes in late 2017.

The Northern Goldfields air routes include services between Perth and the regional towns of Laverton, Leonora, Meekatharra, Mount Magnet and Wiluna.

The existing deed arrangements on the routes have been extended for a further 12 months beyond their previous expiry date.

- **The Carnarvon-Monkey Mia and Northern Goldfields routes are regulated by the Department of Transport**
- **Skippers' deed of agreement on the routes was due to expire on June 27, 2017 and has been extended until July 1, 2018**

Dear Residents.

September was a good month for town and ourselves. Less people charged by us and less crime reported to us.

We were involved in the serious assault investigation involving the truck driver at Meekatharra, with ourselves and Cue Police locating and arresting the offender north of town on the highway.

Cue Mount Magnet Magistrates Court was attended 3 times, with a total of 36 persons appearing before the Magistrate.

We attended to 73 individual tasks, stopped, checked and breathe tested 74 drivers, completed 19 investigations and charged 6 people with a variety of offences.

The September Race Round was held and we believe a great day and night was had by all with no incidents of note resulting. Great work and well done to the Race Club President and Committee.

Off Road Motor Bikes appear to continue to be a reported issue to us.
I'd like to reiterate my message from last month:

When off the road, we have no authority to charge or inspect, regardless of the manner of riding or whether wearing a helmet or not.

The road as defined under the Road Traffic Act 1974 means any highway, road or street open to, or used by, the public and includes every carriageway, footway, reservation, median strip and traffic island thereon. This means property fence line to property fence line.

Unregistered Motor Bikes must not be ridden on any part of a road.

If you witness this, for any enforcement action to occur, you must supply a statement of evidence and being willing to give this evidence in court.

Further you must be able to identify the rider.

When we witness these actions, we provide the same evidence to the court.
